#### "ITINERARY"

Day 1, April 30, Tuesday: Depart for France

Today: Depart New York's JFK International Airport on Air France for our overseas journey to Lourdes

via Paris. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served in flight.

Day 2, May 1, Wednesday: Welcome to Lourdes!

Morning: Arrive in Paris, proceed through Passport Control, and connect to the short flight to Pau. Arrive

at Pau Airport, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way guide as we exit Customs. Board

our private touring bus and we will be on our way to Lourdes for hotel check-in.

The afternoon is free for a visit to the Shrine Domain. Return to the hotel for dinner.

Evening: This evening, participate in the candlelight procession, recitation of the Rosary, and singing of hymns to honor the Mother of God.

Overnight at our hotel in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 3, May 2, Thursday: Full Day in Lourdes

Morning: Breakfast at our hotel. **Celebrate Mass at the Grotto** (*to be confirmed*).

Begin our day of pilgrimage at the **sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes**. Known throughout the world, it is here that the Virgin Mary appeared to the uneducated shepherdess, Bernadette Soubirous, as the Immaculate Conception. The grotto is a place of prayer for all the pilgrims who flock here, many on pilgrimages for the sick. Visit the places associated with the life of St. Bernadette in Lourdes, including the **Boly Mill** where she grew up and the *cachot* where her family moved later in her life. The

sanctuary offers an atmosphere to deepen one's relationship with the Virgin Mary.

Independent lunch and free day for private devotions. Due to the current health situation, it is no longer possible to bathe completely. However, members of the hospitality staff and volunteers are available

to welcome you to the baths and accompany you to perform the "Water Gesture."

The Blessed Sacrament procession is held daily at 5:00 p.m.

The Chapel of Reconciliation is open daily.

Dinner at the hotel restaurant.

Evening: Participate in the candlelight procession, recitation of the Rosary, and singing of hymns to

honor the Mother of God.

Afternoon:

Overnight at our hotel in Lourdes. (B,D)



Day 4, May 3, Friday: Paris

Morning: Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll be transferred to Pau Airport for our continuing flight to Paris. Upon arrival at Paris CDG Airport, collect our

luggage and meet our guide who will take us to our private touring coach.

We'll make a brief stop for an independent lunch.

Afternoon: Then, our guide will bring alive the remarkable sights of the magnificent city

of Paris: the Eiffel Tower, Champs Elysées, Arc de Triômphe, Tomb of Napoleon, Place de la Concorde, Opéra, Bastille Square, and the Place des Vosges. End our day with a visit to the Minor Basilica of Our Lady of Victories. Built in Paris by Louis XIII, the Shrine of Our Lady of Victories is one of the most famous Marian places in the world, well known for the many

graces bestowed by the Virgin Mary on all pilgrims who come to visit her. It was here, in 1875, that Nelson Baker felt a special pull on his heart during Mass. Several other saints have direct associations with Notre-Dame des Victoires, including St. Peter Julian Eymard and St. Thérèse of Lisieux. Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of Victories. Continue to our hotel for

check-in.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Paris. Evening: (B,D)

Day 5, May 4, Saturday: Shrines of Paris | Seine River Cruise

Breakfast at our hotel. Begin our day with a visit to the Shrine of the Morning: Miraculous Medal, located in the heart of Paris at Rue de Bac.

> Celebrate Mass in the Chapel of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal. This chapel is the very place where our Blessed Mother appeared to St. Catherine Labouré between July and December of 1830. Continue to the nearby Shrine

> of St. Vincent de Paul, where his remains are preserved and venerated. Next, we'll continue to the **Ile de la Cité**, in the historic heart of Paris, to see the façade of **Notre Dame Cathedral**, a jewel of gothic art. Visit **Sainte-Chapelle**, a real hidden treasure. Discover the lower part of the chapel with its open design and bright colors, and the upper part flooded with light from its dazzling stained-glass windows. The chapel is an architectural feat with nothing comparable in the world. The relics of the Crown of Thorns were originally housed here prior to their transfer

to Notre Dame Cathedral. Independent lunch.

Visit the Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Montmartre, a sanctuary of Afternoon:

Eucharistic Adoration and Divine Mercy. In 1870, war broke out and France was invaded. People grew to believe that that the ordeals undergone by France were due to spiritual faults rather than merely political ones. This led to the construction of a basilica dedicated to the

Sacred Heart of Jesus in atonement, which became a symbol of hope and spiritual renewal. Continuous adoration of the Eucharist is the vocation of the basilica.

Dinner at a restaurant in Paris. After dinner, enjoy a cruise on the Seine River. See history spanning 1,000 years while passing bridges and the main illuminated monuments of Paris.

Overnight at our hotel in Paris. (B,D)









Evening:

Day 6, May 5, Sunday: Paris | Rome

Morning: Boxed breakfast from our hotel. Very early morning, we will be transferred to Paris Charles de

Gaulle Airport for our continuing flight to Rome. Upon arrival at Leonardo Da Vinci Airport, claim our luggage, and meet a Peter's Way tour manager. Board our private touring bus and we'll be on our way to Rome in time for the **noon Angelus and Papal Blessing in St. Peter's** 

**Square.** Independent lunch.

Afternoon: Free afternoon to enjoy Rome on your own. Check-in at our hotel and return to St. Peter's

Basilica. Celebrate 5:00 p.m. Mass at the Altar of the Chair of St. Peter.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

# <u>Day 7, May 6, Monday: Vatican Museums | Sistine Chapel | St. Peter's Basilica | Scavi Tour</u>

Morning:

Early morning, walk to St. Peter's Basilica to **celebrate** Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter (*subject to confirmation*) or one of the Grotto Chapels. Return to hotel for breakfast. After breakfast, begin our morning of sightseeing with a visit to one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk through the Sistine Chapel and contemplate the frescoes of numerous Renaissance masters and the inspired ceiling of Michelangelo. End our morning tour in St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the awesome

architecture and the statuary including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta." Pray at the tomb of Saint John Paul II in St. Sebastian's Chapel. Time permitting, you may wish to go to the Vatican Crypt to see and pray

near the tomb of St. Peter. Independent lunch.

Afternoon:

Free afternoon to enjoy Rome on your own.

**Scavi Tour** (*subject to confirmation*): The Scavi, or Vatican Necropolis, is the underground excavation under St. Peter's Basilica. In 1939, Pope Pius XII ordered an excavation beneath the grotto of St. Peter's Basilica where many popes are buried. Among the tombs of pagans and early

Christians, far beneath the high altar of St. Peter's, excavators found a shrine amid the rubble. Most scholars concur that the small column is part of a second-century A.D. shrine built by Pomo's small Christian community on the site where St. Peter was buried

limited to 12-15 people.

Evening:

Dinner at La Vittoria Restaurant.

Overnight at our hotel in Rome.

### Day 8, May 7, Tuesday: Tour of Imperial and Historic Rome

Morning:

Breakfast at our hotel

Begin our day with Mass at the Magnificent Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls. After Mass, continue to the ancient Roman Forum. See the Arch of Titus and the Arch of Constantine and proceed to the outside of the Colosseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. We will also see the grandiose white marble monument of King Victor Emmanuel II, often called the "Wedding Cake." See the Trajan Column and the Market (the ancient Roman equivalent of a department store). Independent lunch.



Afternoon:

Enjoy a walking tour of historic Rome. As we visit churches and walk through squares with ornate grand fountains, we will understand why Rome is known as the birthplace of the Baroque style. Begin at the Spanish Steps and Piazza di Spagna, one of the most exclusive and fashionable shopping areas in the world. Continue to the Trevi Fountain, nestled in the historic

center of Rome, then on to the Pantheon, the best-preserved building from ancient Rome, completed in the reign of Hadrian. Its magnificent dome is a lasting testimony to the genius of Roman architects and, as the building stands virtually intact, it offers a unique opportunity for the modern visitor to step back in time. Next, we will visit the lively Piazza Navona, with time to visit the Church of St Agnes in Agony, browse through the artists' stalls, and try one of Rome's most famous products, a tartufo at the Gelateria Tre Scalini. Visit the nearby Church of San Luigi dei Francesi to see *The Calling of St. Matthew*, painted by Baroque master Caravaggio.



Evening:

Dinner at Abruzzi Restaurant.

Overnight at our hotel in Rome.


Day 9, May 8, Wednesday: Papal Audience | Pilgrim Churches of Rome

Morning:

After an early breakfast, enter the heart of Christendom for the Wednesday General Audience. Pope Francis will greet all pilgrims, deliver his message, pray the Pater Noster, and bless religious articles. Independent lunch.

Afternoon:

In the afternoon we will visit the **Basilica of St. Mary Major**, one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (432-440 A.D.). View the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics depicting scenes from the Old Testament. Pray near the relics of Jesus' manger from Bethlehem beneath the high altar, which





**Jerusalem**, which houses fragments of the True Cross brought to Rome by St. Helena, mother of Constantine.

Evening:

Our farewell dinner this evening will be at Cecilia Metella restaurant in Rome. Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and taste wonderful Mediterranean cuisine in a Roman setting with wine and music.
